


Austria





Austria's largest contributions to total EU imports from non-EU countries in 2023 were made in three commodities i.e. wood, rubber, and cattle.









HS 4401 - Fuel wood




HS 1201- Soy Beans



HS 4011 - New Pneumatic tyres




HS 4101 - Cattle raw hides and skins




