

France is one of the top five EU importers of the commodities listed. In 2023, France was the fifth largest importer of the 76 products considered that originate from non-EU countries.

In the table on the right, the import volumes displayed per commodity group include all the products covered under the Regulation in each of these groups. The percentages indicate France's share of total non-EU imports into the EU27.






HS 4401 - Fuel wood




HS 2304- Soy Oilcake




