

Hungary's largest contribution to total EU imports from non-EU countries in 2023 was made in rubber products.

In the table on the right, the import volumes displayed per commodity group include all the products under the Regulation in each of these groups. The percentages indicate Hungary's share of total non-EU imports into the EU27.






HS 4407 - Wood Sawn or chipped lengthwise




HS 2304 - Soy Oilcake



HS 4001 - Natural Rubber




HS 4104 - Cattle tanned or crust hide and skins




