Spain is one of the top-5 EU importers of the commodities listed. In 2023, Spain was the fourth largest importer of the 76 products considered that originate from non-EU countries.

In the table on the right, the import volumes displayed per commodity group include all the products covered under the Regulation in each of these groups. The percentages indicate Spain's share of total non-EU imports into the EU27.

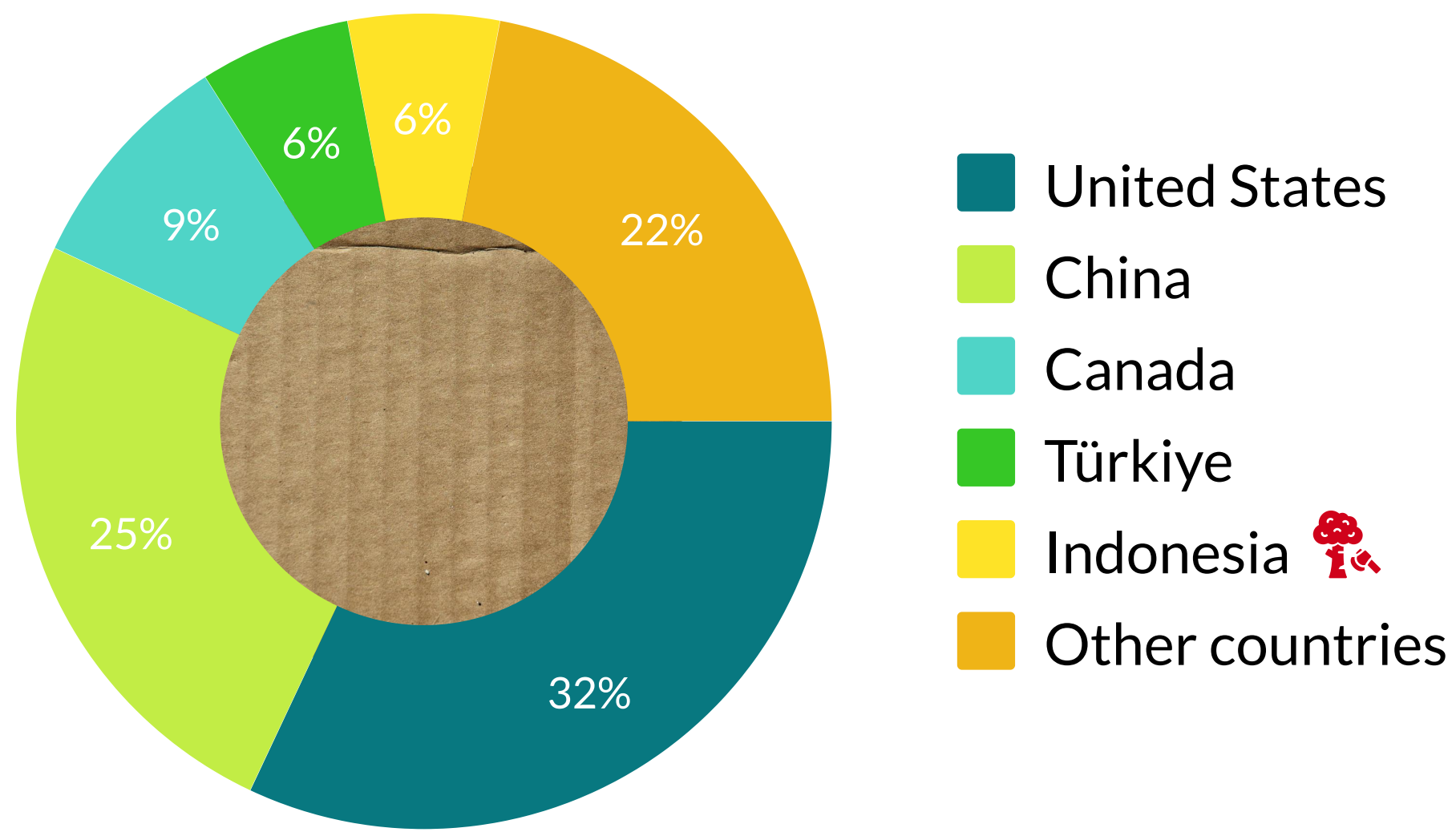

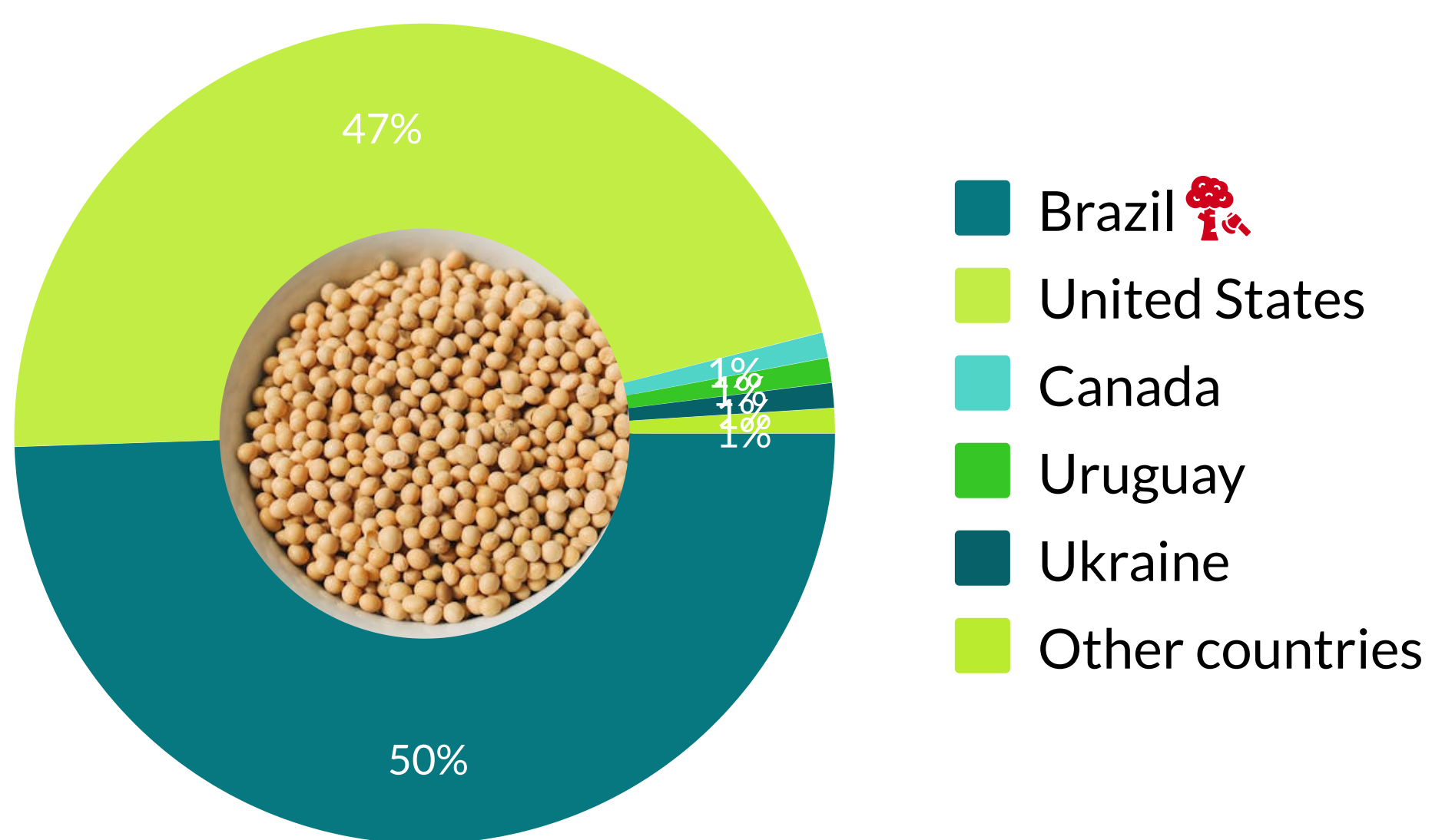

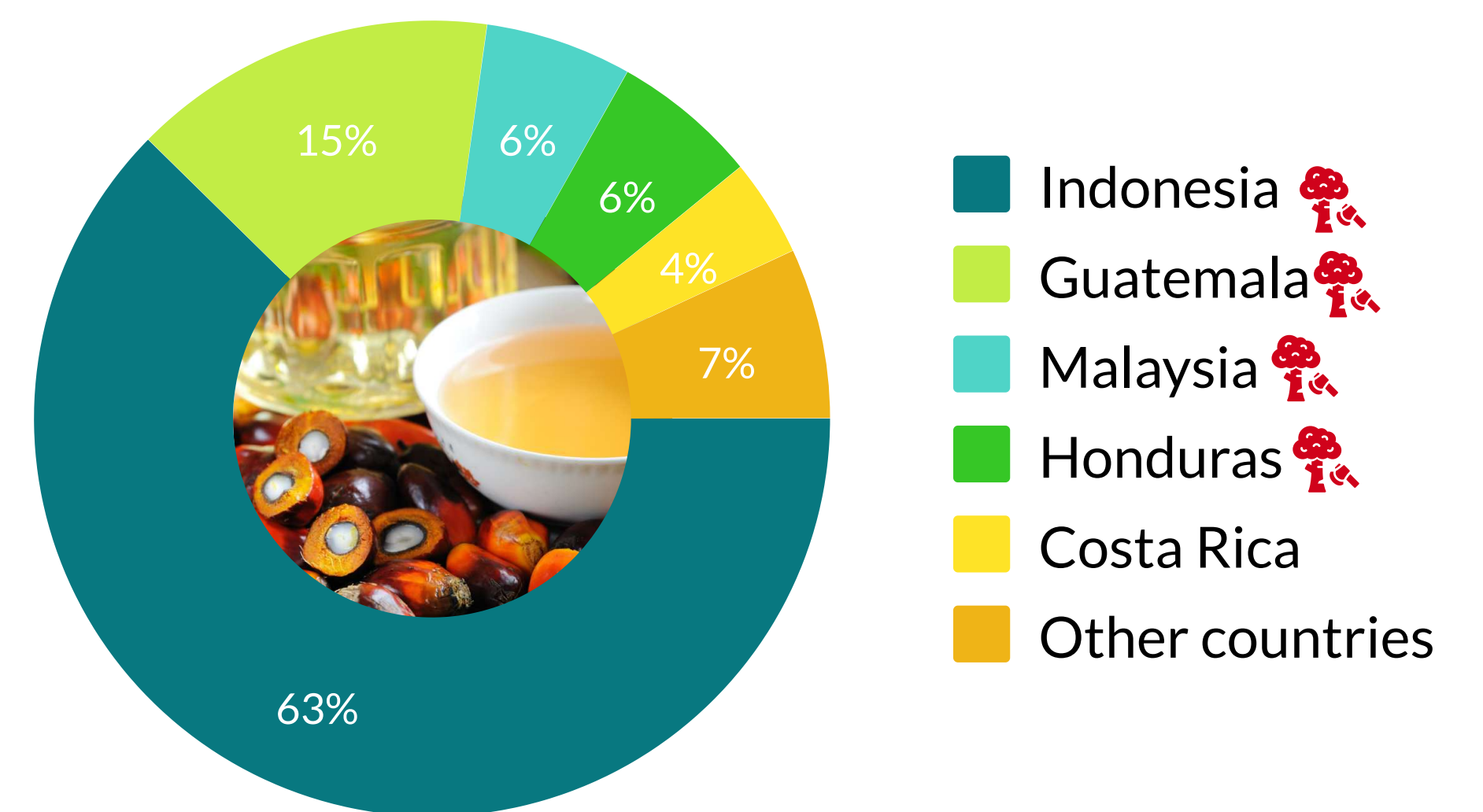

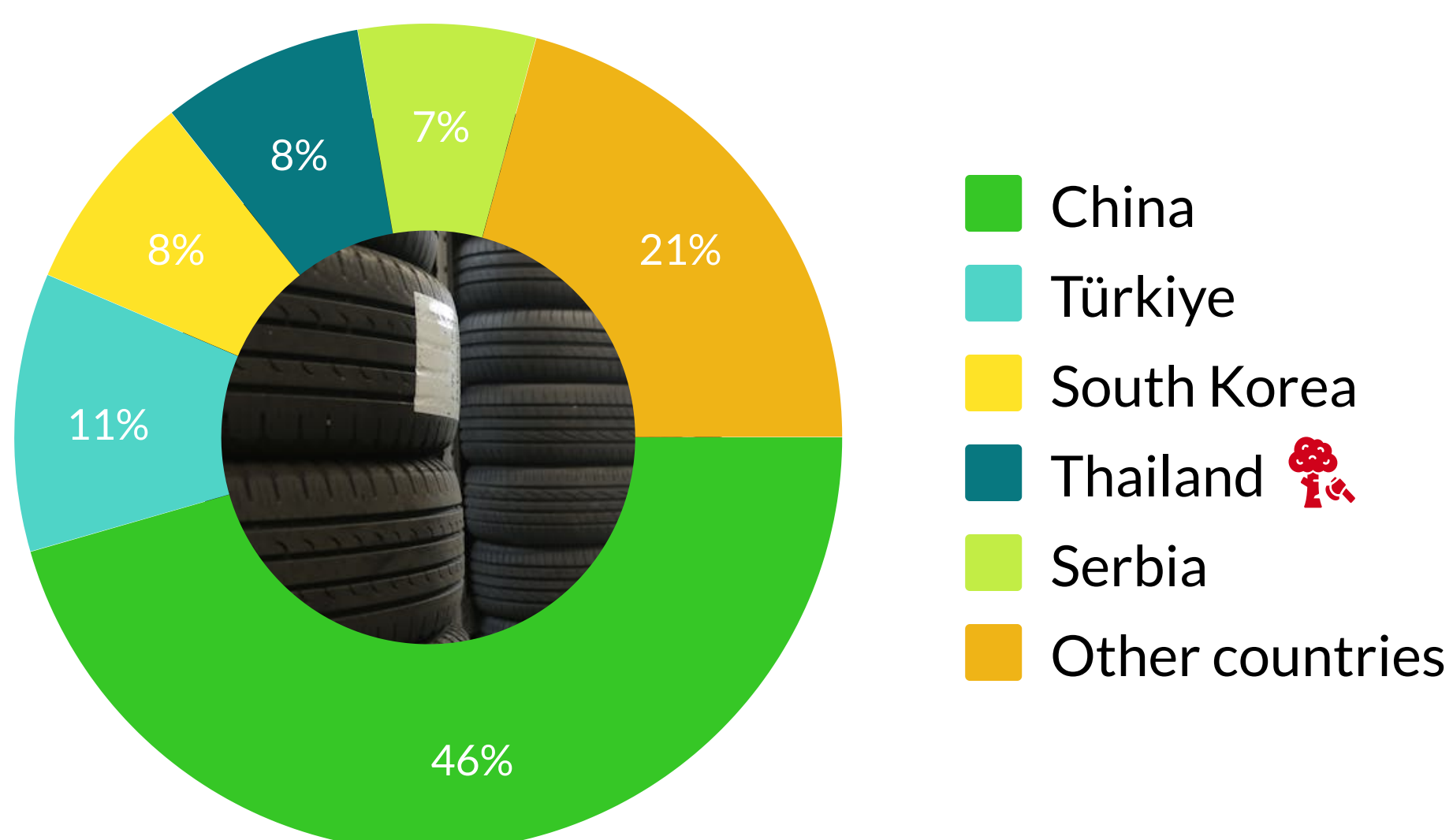
HS 1201- Soybeans



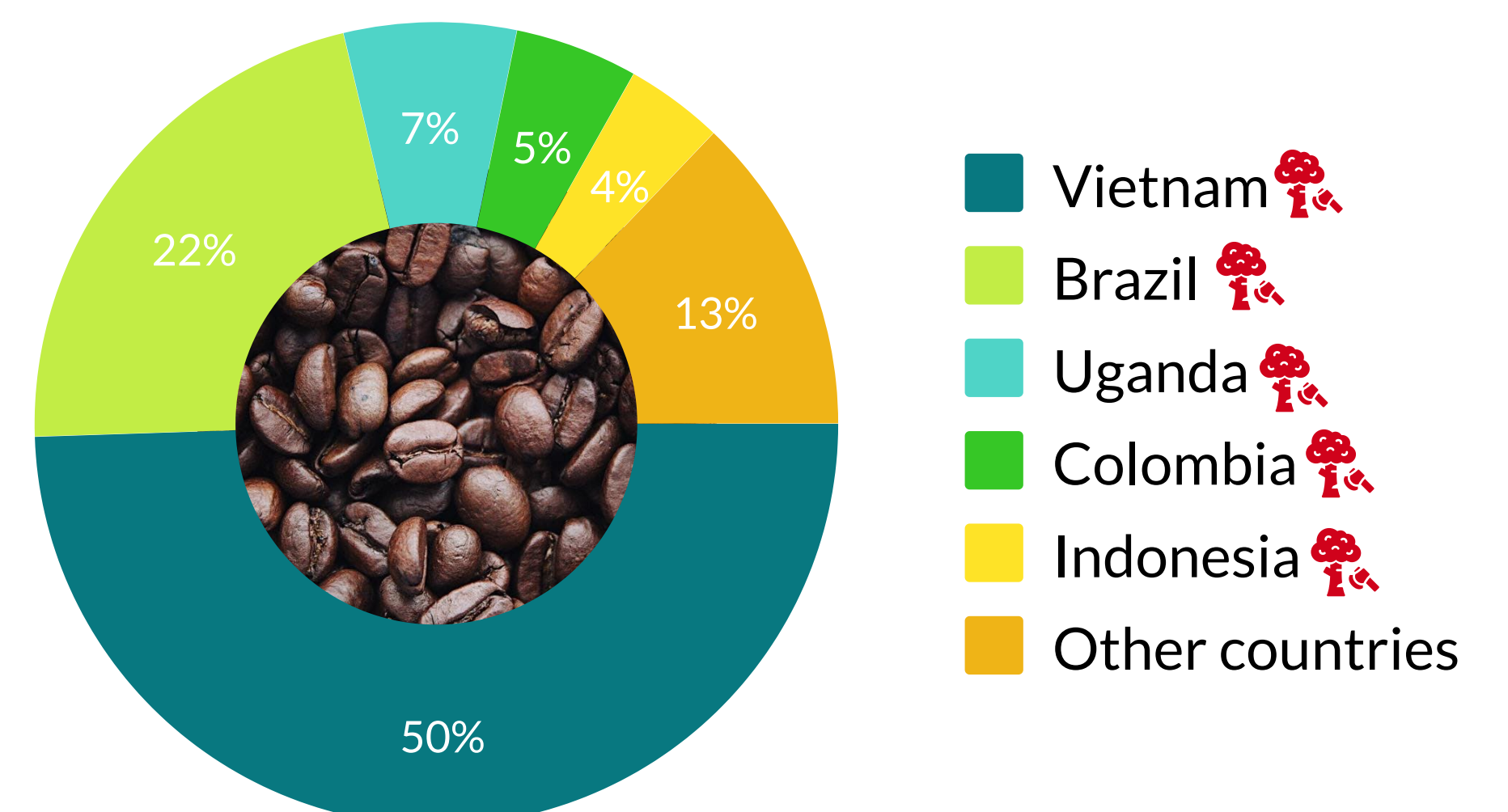
HS 1511- Palm oil and its fractions



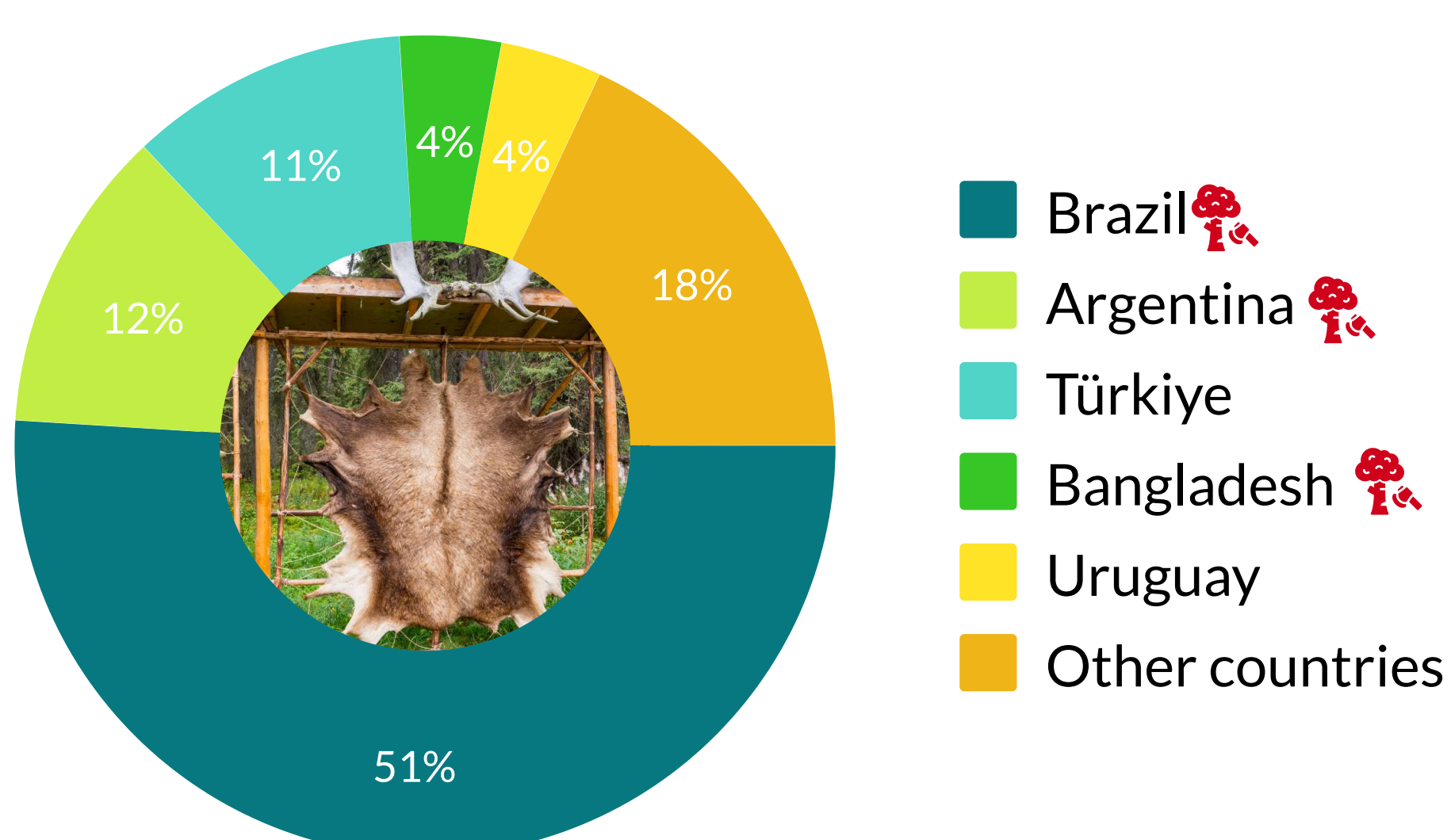
HS 4011 - New Pneumatic tyres
