Prospective subcontractors undergo a rigorous due diligence procedure before being considered for engagement. This process includes thorough reference checks and assessments of their experience, credibility, and integrity. We evaluate potential subcontractors based on criteria such as cost-effectiveness, quality of service, and relevance of experience.
